This name is also found recorded as Almean Delaine Bosworth. Alma's death certificate gives her birth year as 1837. It gives her age as 73 years, 10 months, 9 days; it gives 2pm as the time and Chronic Heart Disease as the cause of death. Alma died as a widow. Her father's birthplace is given as Scotland. Isaac Pierce, of Guysville, is recorded as informant.

1900 Census OH Athens Co. Carthage Twp--Colmer, Alma, head, widowed, age 62; Edward B son age 28; William son age 23. It shows Alma's mother as being born in England

quoted from "Bosworth Genealogy"---Hezekiah and Huldah begin their married life in Whitehall, NY, where they lived until about 1815 when they emigrated to Jefferson Co., OH, but their stay there was short, and not long after they removed down the river to Meigs Co., Oh, where they settled. A history of the township of Bedford, Meigs Co., gives Hezekiah Bosworth as one of the first settlers there at "sometime previous to 1830". This history says that "many were the toils and privations that these resolute men underwent...and their posterity...are reaping the harvest." For one thing salt was very scarce and high and there was no mill for grinding their grain. Among the settlers was a Wm. Pierce (who may have been related to Huldah) who in 1807 had settled in Orange Twp. one mile above the mouth of Meigs Creek, His son-in-law James Ryther bought a pair of mill stones at Marietta and brought them by canoe to the mouth of the Hocking River and thence by ox team to Mr. Pierce's residence. These mill stones were about 20 inches in diameter, made of flagstones. They were among the first brought into Meigs county and at the time the history was written (1894) were in the possession of Stephen Bosworth, one of Hezekiah's sons.*

In the US Census of 1810 we find Hezekiah living in Whitehall, NY, with wife, 3 sons under 10 and 2 daughters. As we have a record of only 2 sons and 2 daughters born before 1810 it must be one of these "three" sons was a twin who died young, or it was a mistake of the census taker.--end quote

Marriage Notes for Joseph Tilson and Hannah Waterman:

from the book "The Tilson Genealogy", written by Mercer V. Tilson and published by the Memorial Press, 1911: " Joseph Tilson and wife, soon after marriage went to Hartford, Maine, which was then comparatively a wild country. (incorporated a town, 1798) He purchased 100 acres of land in the north part of Hartford, being a part of the "Thompson Grant". Hannah died in Hartford Feb. 8, 1811. In March 1811, he bought 17 acres, and in May of same year, 51 acres. In the fall of 1811, with 5 little children from 3 to 8 years of age (motherless), he moved with a two horse wagon to Halifax, Massachusetts. With others, he engaged in getting iron ore in Jones River Pond (Silver Lake) at what is known as Peterson Cove in Pembroke, Mass., and in other places. He m. 2d Betsy Everson of Kingston, Mass., May 22, 1815. In the fall of 1817 in company with other families from Halifax, he moved to Marietta, OH, going with horse and wagon, there being no other conveyance in those days. He left the 2 sons in Halifax, taking the 3 daughters with him. He purchased a farm about 3 miles west of Marietta, (owned in 1895 by Kaylor), where he died (from falling on the ice at the doorstep) March 27, 1849. Mrs Betsy Tilson died in 1850, both are buried in West Marietta cemetery.

My father never knew anything about his sisters after they left Halifax, Mass. In 1895 I visited Marietta, hoping to get some trace of my 3 aunts. I found on record Eliza Tilson m. Levi Clark, March 30 1825. Was informed that a little Clark child lived with my grandfather. This was as far as I could trace, so I concluded the mother soon died. I visited the old home place, drank water from the spring my grandfather drank from more than 75 years ago. In May 1897, on my way from New Orleans, La., to Massachusetts, I again visited Marietta, and succeeded in finding Mrs Martha A Clark, the child referred to above, from whom I got some history of the aunts that we had not known about for 80 years."

Marietta, December 28th, 1817.

Dear Father and Mother & Friends:

I here sit down to write a few lines to you to inform you that we have got here with much fatigue, and it took a great while, for we took the worst time we could have had for we was all over in mud sometimes, and the road through pensylvania for three hundred miles was such, but we got to pitsburg and stoped there and finally made a boat to go down by water and set off now I found this to be much the easiest and least expense. Then I found we had missed the way, for we might have gone to the head of Allegany river. We might got here with half the time and expense. The boats the family go down the river in are twelve feet wide and about twenty-five and from forty feet in length, and three or four familys will go down the river in them. The current generally sets them fifty miles in a day if the weather is good, but we got here well and found our Brother and his family enjoying the same blessing. They remember

there love to you all. I know but little about the country yet but I will state the particulars at some future time, but what I have seen I like very well. The town of Marietta is a handsome settlement and good regulations and clever civil people. I have no more to write and must subscribe

Notes for Elisha Waterman Tilson:

from the Tilson Genealogy, by Mercer V. Tilson (1911): At the age of eight years Elisha W. Tilson was bound to Seth Briggs of Halifax, Mass., and worked on the farm. (The house stood one-fourth of a mile south of Halifax R. R. station, on the west side of the road.) He was compelled to work hard, and sometimes did not have sufficient food. He often said that he never went to school but thirteen weeks. At the age of sixteen he was apprenticed to the blacksmith trade at William Ford's, in Pembroke, Mass. (In 1897 the place was owned by Frances T. Crafts.) About 1825 he went to Halifax and engaged in blacksmithing. (The shop stood one-fourth of a mile west of the church, on the same side of the road.) About 1828 he went to Chelmsford, Mass.; remained there until 1834, when he removed to (Bryantville) Pembroke, and worked at his trade for Martin Bryant in a new shop. In the winter of 1838 he worked for Joshua Sturtevant (near Conant's Corner), East Bridgewater, Mass. The same year he moved his family one mile east to Bryantville and built a blacksmith shop. In 1839 he worked for Cobb & Cushing at Hanson, Mass. Dec., 1839, he moved his family to a new house at Kingston, near the Pembroke line, and worked as blacksmith and machinist at the Anchor Works of James Holmes, who failed in that business, 1842. In Oct., 1842, the family moved to Hanover, Mass. He was employed in the Anchor Works of George Curtis until the spring of 1845, when he moved to Pembroke, near the place where he had learned his trade. He worked at blacksmithing until 1850, when he engaged in shoe making, and with his children, made a prosperous occupation. In 1851 he built a house nearly one mile east of Bryantville, next to the place where he lived in 1838. About 1860 he gave up shoe work and began blacksmithing and making shoe tools. He was one of the first inventors of the edge plane in making shoes, and had a large sale a number of years. He was a very ingenious person and skilled in the art of tempering and working metals. In politics he was an old line Whig; afterwards became a Republican. He was a man of physical endurance, seldom sick; was kind to his family and worked hard to support it. Left without father or mother to guide, he has done well his work in this life. He died at his home in Pembroke, June 11, 1888, respected by all who knew him.

Notes for Joseph Tilson:

Joseph Tilson lived with his grandfather Elisha Waterman at Halifax until of age. He learned the carpenter trade, but was a farmer most of his life at Ashburnham, Peterboro, N. H., Halifax and Hanson, Mass. He remembered when his father moved from Maine, and when he moved to Ohio he said his father intended to take the two sons to Ohio, but unable to pay expense of his living at his grandfather, decided to leave both sons in Mass. (from The Tilson Genealogy, by Mercer V. Tilson, 1911)

Notes for Jabin Sr. Bosworth:

Jabin was a soldier of the Revolution. At the end of the war his name was on a Roster of New York State troops entitled to 500 acres of land. It appears he never claimed his land. He owned and operated a gristmill in Whitehall, NY

Anna and her husband lived in various places in the US and Canada. It was while living in Canada that they "joined the Mormons under the leadership of Joseph Smith and came to Hannibal, NY, in 1847." Later, while on their way West with the Mormons, Thomas Downey died near Quincy, Illinois and was buried there. Their eldest daughter, Eliza Downey Robinson, died in childbirth in a covered wagon while the Indians were chasing them, and was buried in a grave dug 20 minutes after her death. Anna married 2nd. to Joel Judd and they taught a select school in Springfield, Illinois, where he died. Anna, for the second time a widow, went to live with her son Calvin in Webster Co., Illinois, where she died in 1856 at the age of 76----"Bosworth Genealogy" by Mary Bosworth Clarke, source

Notes for John Waterman:

As can be ascertained from the following records, John Waterman moved from Marshfield to Plymouth by the time of his marriage in 1665. Then, by the time of the birth of his children, he moved back to Marshfield, where the birth of his children are recorded from 1671 to 1685. Subsequently, he sold his homestead in Marshfield in 1687 and returned to the section of Plymouth which would be Plympton in 1695.

In 5 Oct. 1687, John and Anna Waterman were dismissed from the church in Plymouth church to join the new church in Plympton.

On 1 Aug. 1669, Samuel Sturtevant's will mentioned his son-in-law, John Waterman [The Mayflower Descendant, 18-188}. Anne Waterman was one of the witnesses to the will of Lt. John Tomson of Middleborough, Mass., 23 Apr. 1696 [ibid., 4-24.25].

It appears that Jonathan's abhorrence of the act of Jonathan, Jr., in joining the Baptists was such that he would not call him son but mentions him as Joseph's "Brother." From William Bradford's manuscript:

"In sundrie of these stormes the winds were so feirce, & ye seas so high, as they could not beare a knote of saile, but were forced to hull, for divers days together. And in one of them, as they thus lay at hull, in a mighty storme, a lustie yonge man (called John Howland) coming upon some occasion above ye grattings, was, with a seele of ye shipe throwne into (ye) sea; but it pleased God yt he caught hould of ye top-saile halliards, which hunge over board, & rane out at length; yet he held his hould (though he was sundrie fadomes under water) till he was hald up by ye same rope of ye brime of ye water, and then with a boat hooke and other means got into ye shipe againe, and his life was saved; and though he was something ill with it, yet he lived many years after, and became a profitable member both in church & comone wealthe."

Notes for Moses Simmons:

Formerly spelled and written "Moyses Symonson" came to Plymouth in the "Fortune," landing on November ninth, 1621, and is usually reckoned as one of the Pilgrims, being among the earliest settlers of Plymouth, and was a child of one whom was in communion with the Dutch of Lyden, and being admitted into Church fellowship at Plymouth, New England, and his children also admitted to baptism as well as our own. (Winslow's History 1646.)

Moses Simmons was married, (probably in Duxbury) about 1632 to Sarah (most of the early writers think she was Sarah Chandler, daughter of Roger Chandler, but no definite record obtainable.)

Moses Simmons died in Duxbury, in 1691 and his will was filed for probate by his son John, Sept. 15th, 1691, The inventory of his estate was taken Sept. 10th, 1691, by Thomas Delano and Edward Southward, and presented to the court by John Simmons.

The following is a copy of the will of Moses Simmons of the "Fortune" as it appears on the records at Plymouth and is certified to be correct copy:

"THE LAST WILL AND TESTEMENT OF MOSES SIMMONS"

I, being aged and full of decaye but in my right and perfect understanding and not knowing the day of my death, do will that my estate shall thus be disposed of after my decease;

In the name of God Amen

Item 1- I do will and bequeath my body to the grave and that it he decently burried and funeral charges defrayed out of my estate before any legacie. And my Soul to God that gave it me whome I trust hath redeemed it.

Item 2- I do will that all my personall debts be paid out of my personall estate.

At one point, on Oct. 27, 1680, he adjusted a boundary line between his lands and those of Mrs. Sarah Parke and William Brewster. He served as a Duxbury town officer and as a representative or deputy to the General Court at Plymouth, being repeatedly elected to the court from 1654 to 1663, then again in 1668, and continuously from 1671 to 1682. Thomas Alger, the immigrant ancestor of C. C. Alger, of Winchendon, Massachusetts, was born in England. The first record in America relating to Thomas Alger is found in Watertown. It shows that he settled first in Roxbury and then came to Watertown and bought three-quarters of an acre of land with a fulling mill thereon, May 30, 1663, of Timothy Hawkins. *John Alden. Perley cites him as
the son of John Alden and Priscilla Mullins.*

This John was, at the time, 70 years of age, wealthy and resided in Boston. He was sent for on May 28th and arrived May 31st. Gedney, Hawthorne and Corwin conducted his examination. When the accusing girls discovered that it was John Alden, of Plymouth fame, they cried out against him, "there stands Alden, a bold fellow, with his hat on before the judges, he sells powder and shot to the Indians and French and lies with the Indian squaws, and has Indian papooses."

The magistrates "bid Alden look upon the accusers, " which he did, and they fell down. Alden asked Mr. Gedney what reason there was why his looking at Mr. Gedney did not strike him down as well, but no answer was forthcoming.

Alden was sent to jail, but escaped therefrom.
